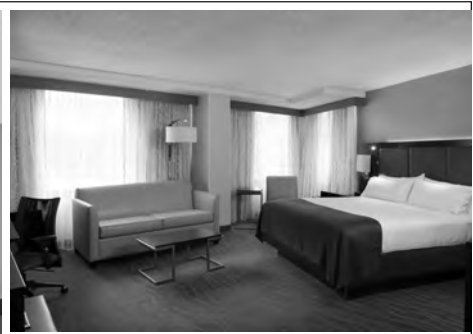

## The Gonzaga DC Classic Pedro Arrupe Service Award



The Gonzaga Fathers' Club established the Gonzaga DC Classic Pedro Arrupe Service Award in 2007. The award is named in honor of the great Jesuit priest, Father Pedro Arrupe, whose life personified service to others and who is often referred to as the "Second Founder" of the Jesuits. Created in 2007 by Jim Hanagan, the award recognizes a Gonzaga graduate who has lived his life in service to others and meets the standards of being a "Man for Others."

The Gonzaga Fathers' Club and the Gonzaga DC Classic Tournament Committee are proud to present the 2014 Pedro Arrupe Service Award to Marcus Washington, Class of 1998.

As a young child growing up in Washington D.C., the value of education was impressed upon Marcus early by his family. Marcus graduated from Holy Comforter Saint Cyprian Elementary School and matriculated at Gonzaga College High School. Under the tutelage of many great teachers and coaches, he learned the value of service, dedication, and hard work. Gonzaga emphasized giving back and it was through service projects that Marcus solidified his interest in mission driven work. During his time at Gonzaga, Marcus was a member of back to back WCAC football championships, and also won the Class of 1959 Leadership award.

Marcus then attended the College of William and Mary, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Public Policy and Government. While at the College, Marcus started at defensive tackle for The Tribe for three years and was a four year letter winner. Even though he was committed to both academics and athletics, Marcus made it a point to continue his dedication to community service, and while in Williamsburg he was a member of the Big Brothers Big Sisters of America. the College that Marcus began his lifelong commitment to teaching. While in school, Marcus served as a substitute teacher in various schools in the Williamsburg area and decided to make teaching his career.

Since that time, Marcus worked as a sixth grade teacher at the Potomac School, while earning his Master's Degree in Secondary Education. After a few years, Marcus returned to Gonzaga, and taught U.S. History. He also served as a football and track coach, and served as on the admissions committee. He also helped to lead several service projects during this time to such places as Emmitsburg and Red Cloud.

In 2010, Marcus became the Assistant Headmaster at the Washington Jesuit Academy, a middle school for boys from low income communities that focuses on interrupting the cycle of poverty in D.C.'s most underserved communities. In 2011, he became Headmaster and oversaw the expansion of WJA to a fifth grade. Since then, Marcus has helped expand the reach of WJA through parent initiatives and partnerships throughout the city. In addition to helping provide students with first rate educational opportunities, Marcus has helped many young boys in the DC area reach their full potential and grow to become "Men for Others"

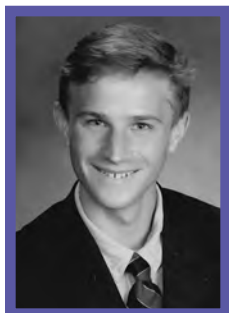

The 2013 Mike Kelleher Scholar-Athlete Award



The Michael Kelleher Scholar–Athlete Award is a significant honor created by the Gonzaga DC Classic Tournament. The award is named in honor of the founder of the Tournament, Michael Kelleher. Mike died suddenly on November 22, 1996 but his legacy has continued to inspire the Tournament. Mike had a vision to create a basketball tournament which would bring high school teams to Washington DC to participate in competitive games and to enjoy the unique environment and history of our Nation’s Capital through such activities as tours of the White House, the Capitol and visits to historical monuments. It was Mike’s dream that this Tournament would also generate good will among the players and coaches from different parts

of our country and create lasting memories for them. Our Annual Team Breakfast helps to do such. The Tournament Committee will always remember Mike for his contribution to the Tournament and for his dedication to Gonzaga.

This year the Scholar-Athlete Award will be presented to Gonzaga Senior Peter Sikorsky. Peter has been a member of the Varsity Cross Country and Track teams; he carries a 4.12 grade point average taking AP classes and has participated in numerous Gonzaga Service Projects such as McKenna’s Wagon, Food and Friends, and the Apopka Immersion Program in Florida over spring break. He has also been referred to as the “backbone” of the Gonzaga Campus Kitchen service, not only working in it during the school year but also during the summer months. Peter has described himself as follows:

The Gonzaga College High School Service Program provides significant volunteer experiences for *freshmen, sophomores and juniors*, which culminate in a forty-hour service requirement for *seniors*. As an integral part of a Gonzaga student's education towards becoming a "Man for Others", the service program is designed to provide service experiences that increase in depth and intensity as the student matures. What begins as a sheltered exposure for freshmen with the poor and needy (**The Father McKenna Center**, a drop in center for homeless men, located on our campus), tutoring at the **Washington Jesuit Academy** and preparing as well as delivering meals to the elderly poor in our neighborhood through **Campus Kitchens**) grows into an increased affiliation with society's marginalized as the program brings *sophomores* to the streets of Washington, DC (**McKenna's Wagon**, a soup kitchen on wheels) and *juniors* to the homes of our elderly ill neighbors (**Food & Friends**). Beyond the comfort zone of Washington, DC there are spring-break opportunities to live and work immigrant families in **Apopka, Florida** as well as an environmental immersion experience with **The Chesapeake Bay Foundation**.

During their senior year, Gonzaga students complement their community service experiences with an academic course (**Social Justice**) in which they are asked to observe examples of structural injustice, to develop critical analysis of its causes and to develop solutions in light of their faith-justice tradition. The forty-hour community service component of this course enables the seniors to reflect on their direct contact with the poor and marginalized through their tutoring at **Amos III Charter School and Wheatley Elementary School** and serving the homeless and hungry at **So Others Might Eat (S.O.M.E.)**

In addition to opportunities offered during the academic year, Gonzaga provides numerous service programs for students during the summer. **The Emmitsburg Project** is a weeklong community service experience in **Appalachia** for *freshmen and sophomores*. Another summer program available to freshmen and sophomores is the **McKenna Immersion Week** in which our students experience the lived reality of the poor in D.C. In conjunction with their Social Justice course, rising seniors have the opportunity to serve the poor and needy both nationally through summer projects in **Camden, New Jersey; New Orleans, Louisiana;** on the **Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota** and internationally in the **Dominican Republic and Ecuador**.

Service is a strong tradition at Gonzaga. A big reason why our Service Program is so vibrant is due in large measure to the tremendous support it receives from the entire Gonzaga family – especially the Gonzaga Fathers' Club and the D.C. Classic. We are indeed most grateful!



### CULTURE OF SERVICE

Community service is immensely important at Gonzaga. Indeed, the school's namesake, St. Aloysius Gonzaga, died while ministering to plague victims in Europe. In the classroom, the chapel, and the community, students are surrounded by models for service and Gonzaga seeks to provide our students with the opportunity to grow in generosity by service to those around them.

The following are personal reflections written by Gonzaga students on their experience of service to others locally, nationally, and internationally. Gonzaga students are taught the goal of Ignatian Spirituality - to "find God in all things." Gonzaga students offer their thoughts, insights, and reactions to their encounters with Jesus through their service to others. Gonzaga's service program is firmly rooted in the values of social justice and generosity. The culture of service at Gonzaga is an important part of a student's education at Gonzaga. Indeed, that culture of service to the poor and marginalized helps to transform each Gonzaga student into becoming a "Man for Others."

### SUMMER SERVICE

There's a lot that we could miss when we're not taking the time to observe. Here at Gonzaga College High School, one of our greatest attributes is our location: smack-dab in the heart of the nation's capital. *En media res*, meaning "in the midst of things," is a saying that you'll hear thrown around often, which reflects this ideal. Despite this endearing aspect of our daily school lives, how many of us can actually say that we really *know* D.C. and have experienced the big picture? When some think of D.C., they'll immediately say okay, *Obama, White House, Congress or Skins, Zards, Nats and Caps*. But what about poverty, unemployment and homelessness? To experience what life means for the tens of thousands of people in Washington who don't have a permanent place to stay, you'd have to look a bit deeper.

It's an early Monday morning in late June, and we've all gathered in the chapel to celebrate mass. Fr. Gap LoBiondo S.J. engaged us in his usual upbeat, cheery demeanor, surveying the flock of Gonzaga Eagles perched amongst various pews. Fr. Gap asked us what we had hoped to accomplish during the week. For me, it was simple: I wanted to become closer to my school and my hometown, Washington, D.C., through doing some good work and witnessing the city from a different perspective. I suspected that the others shared my sentiments, there was a yearning to know D.C. past Eye Street.

We spent the week making and serving breakfast and lunch to the guests of the McKenna Center, keeping the facilities spic and span, and tending to its general maintenance and upkeep. At least that was the general rundown, in between there were grocery runs to the local Giant, walking tours of the city spearheaded by our fearless adult leaders Mr. Szolosi and Mr. Sullivan, a trip to Ben's Chili Bowl, an Orioles game and much more.

Our experience with Washington was very intimate. We walked to get around, hopping on the occasional MetroBus. We went up to serve breakfast and lunch shifts at SOME in small groups throughout the week. With the field in the middle of a grand makeover, we took to a basketball court up the street and played a pickup game with a few local guys. At Ben's we were regaled with wonderful stories of the restaurant's history as well as its claim to fame. Later that day, at Meridian Hill Park, we happened to encounter Mr. Kanai, whom once taught at our beloved Gonzaga (once an Eagle, always an Eagle) and played an intense game of ultimate frisbee. During the week, we became acquainted with the men whom frequent the McKenna Center, some had fallen on hard luck, others had made mistakes and were trying to get back on track, and in all of them we saw a bit of ourselves. It was both

### OVERVIEW OF SERVICE PROJECTS

**Apopka, Florida** - During spring break of junior year, a group of students travel to the town of Apopka in Central Florida to live and work with a migrant farming community.

**Camden, New Jersey** - Students spend one week following their junior year at Camden's Oscar Romero Center. They experience urban poverty in new ways by living more simply and helping the city's social service agencies.



**Campus Kitchen** - In January 2006, Gonzaga proudly launched the first high school chapter of the Campus Kitchens Project, a national organization dedicated to feeding those in need. Our Campus Kitchen collects unused food from the school cafeteria, local restaurants and businesses and working with DC Central Kitchen and Gonzaga's own McKenna Center, students then use these donations to prepare and deliver meals to elderly and low-income residents in our neighborhood. The program operates year-round during four afternoons each week and is open to all Gonzaga students.

**Dominican Republic** - Following junior year, a group of students spend two weeks of their summer living with families in a Dominican village, constructing sanitation facilities and

In the evening, we would sit together and reflect; we'd reflect on the things we had seen and done, the people we had met, and what we had learned. We'd reflect on the Bible and how God would want us to regard those less fortunate than us. In that same spirit, I once again reflect back to that groggy Monday morning and Fr. Gap's smiling face. *Jesus is homeless*, he said. We were on the cusp of experiencing this firsthand, but it had already been laid out for us on the first day. Its true meaning had resonated throughout the week. Homeless people are still people, and when you actively choose to listen to one and find out who they really are, there's a good chance that you'll learn something new from them. You probably pass a few everyday on your way to and from school. But then again, we could miss a lot when we don't take the time to observe.

**Food & Friends** - Each Monday, juniors spend their lunch periods delivering hot lunches and groceries to the doors of homebound neighbors who suffer from HIV/AIDS, and other terminal illnesses. The purpose of this program is for the students to offer nourishment and a smile to the homebound, who are not able to interact personally with many other people.

**Emmitsburg, Maryland** - Each summer, Gonzaga juniors, as rising senior leaders, together with a number of sophomores and freshmen volunteer their time for the poor and elderly while living at the Bellarmine Retreat Center in Emmitsburg, Maryland. The volunteers chop wood, mow lawns and perform general maintenance and landscape work for the disadvantaged citizens in and around the Emmitsburg area.

**McKenna Center** - The McKenna Center is the extensive parish outreach operation of St. Aloysius Gonzaga Church, located next to our school. The program is named for Fr. Horace McKenna, a Jesuit who lived at Gonzaga. Nearly every day of the school year, students volunteer to provide breakfast and lunch to the homeless served by the McKenna Center. Typically, upperclassmen help out with breakfast, while underclassmen volunteer for lunch shifts, guided by senior leaders.



**McKenna's Wagon** - Every Wednesday evening, three sophomores, one senior and one faculty member volunteer on McKenna's Wagon a soup kitchen on wheels named for Gonzaga's own Fr. Horace McKenna and operated by Martha's Table. They stop in two parks in downtown Washington and serve soup and sandwiches to over 100 homeless people. Students receive an opportunity to relate directly with the hungry and the homeless of Washington, DC.



**New Orleans, Louisiana** - One of the latest initiatives and in response to the continuing cry for assistance from the communities affected by Katrina, rising seniors travel to New Orleans'

St. Bernard Parish where they assist in the rebuilding of lives and the reconstruction of homes.

**WJA Chess Club** - Every Week, Gonzaga students visit the Washington Jesuit Academy, a Washington middle-school for boys from low income communities in grade 5 through 8, to moderate their chess club, play chess and connect with the boys.



**S.O.M.E. - So Others Might Eat** - Each Thursday of the school year, a group of eight seniors work at SOME, just up the road from Gonzaga. They help serve and clean up breakfast (400 meals) and lunch (500 meals) for needy people of our city. In addition, seniors represent political, municipal, and governmental interests in a mock town meeting about issues of homelessness and low-income housing. Students consider issues of homelessness while serving food to the people of Washington who would otherwise go hungry.

**Ecuador** - In 2011, the Ecuador service project was begun. Gonzaga students and two chaperones traveled to the capital city of Quito. They served in the Working Boys Center, which was created by Padre Juan, S.J. in 1964. The center helps working boys and their families in teaching them trades, providing education, financial assistance and free clinics.

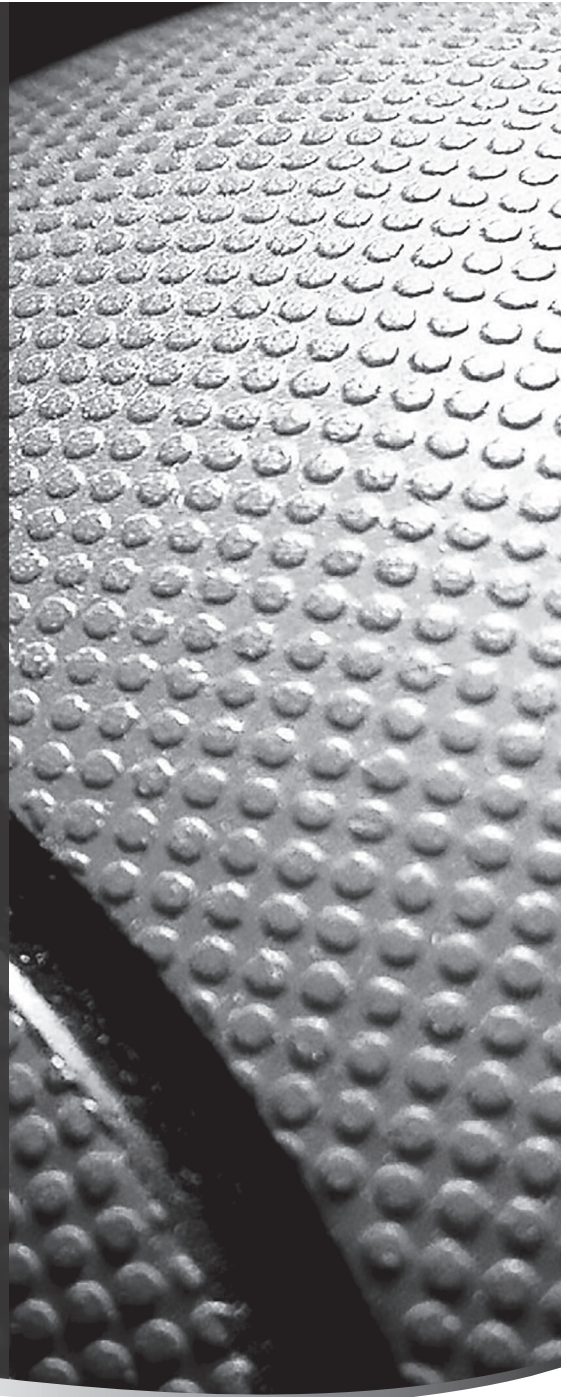
It serves over 400 families annually and is known throughout South America. The Gonzaga students also helped tutor adults and the boys at the center.

GIVE ME SHELTER



The structure pictured above was the actual abode of the Dominican family shown below. This is typical living quarters which students encounter during service trips to the Dominican Republic. It is made of scraps of tin or metal and sometimes pieces of wood, cardboard or banana husks. This is called "home" by many poor in the Dominican Republic and in other third world countries. The inside of this "home" reflects the same austerity as the outside, i.e., dirt floors, no electricity, candles for lighting, no indoor plumbing or running water, no kitchen facilities and very few bedroom items. Gonzaga students in working with the poor help to improve such living conditions. The picture below shows the same Dominican family in their new home.

TOURNAMENT T-SHIRTS SUPPORT FAIR WAGES

For most of its 26 years the Tournament has provided complimentary t-shirts to all Tournament players and coaches. The t-shirts have always carried our Tournament logo on the front with the names of the teams and a design reflective of the Tournament on the back. While those outward signs are important to us, what has become just as important is the small tag or label inside the shirt. For the past seven years, the Tournament has been purchasing its t-shirts from garment companies that support fair working conditions and a "living" wage for their employees. "No Sweat" and now "Alta Gracia" are the labels that are found attached to the inside of the shirts we purchase. The t-shirts for this year's Tournament are made in Villa Altagracia (meaning "exalted grace"), a small poverty-ridden town in the Dominican Republic. Many garment factories in third world countries pay grossly inadequate wages to their workers and subject them to what has become known as "sweatshop conditions." Alta Gracia pays three and a half times the prevailing minimum wage. Many colleges and universities are increasingly turning to companies such as Alta Gracia to provide them with sports garments. Duke University was the first university to adopt an anti-sweatshop code of conduct. Many other colleges and universities are following Duke's initiative. At Duke University's flagship campus store, Alta Gracia merchandise is prominently displayed. It runs full page ads in its campus newspaper for fair-wage produced garments. Barnes and Noble College Booksellers also plans to market the Alta Gracia garments at college bookstores. Joseph Bozich, CEO of Knights Apparel, who is prominently involved in promoting fair wages and fair working conditions in the production of sports garments said "We're hoping to prove that doing good can be good business, that they're not mutually exclusive." We of the Tournament Committee wholeheartedly agree. The Gonzaga DC Classic Tournament is, we believe, the only High School Basketball Tournament to promote fair labor conditions and fair wages by purchasing and giving to the teams t-shirts made by companies such as "No Sweat" and "Alta Gracia." We believe that in doing such we hold true to the motto of presenting "Great Basketball Supporting Good Works." ~ John McLaughlin, Chairman

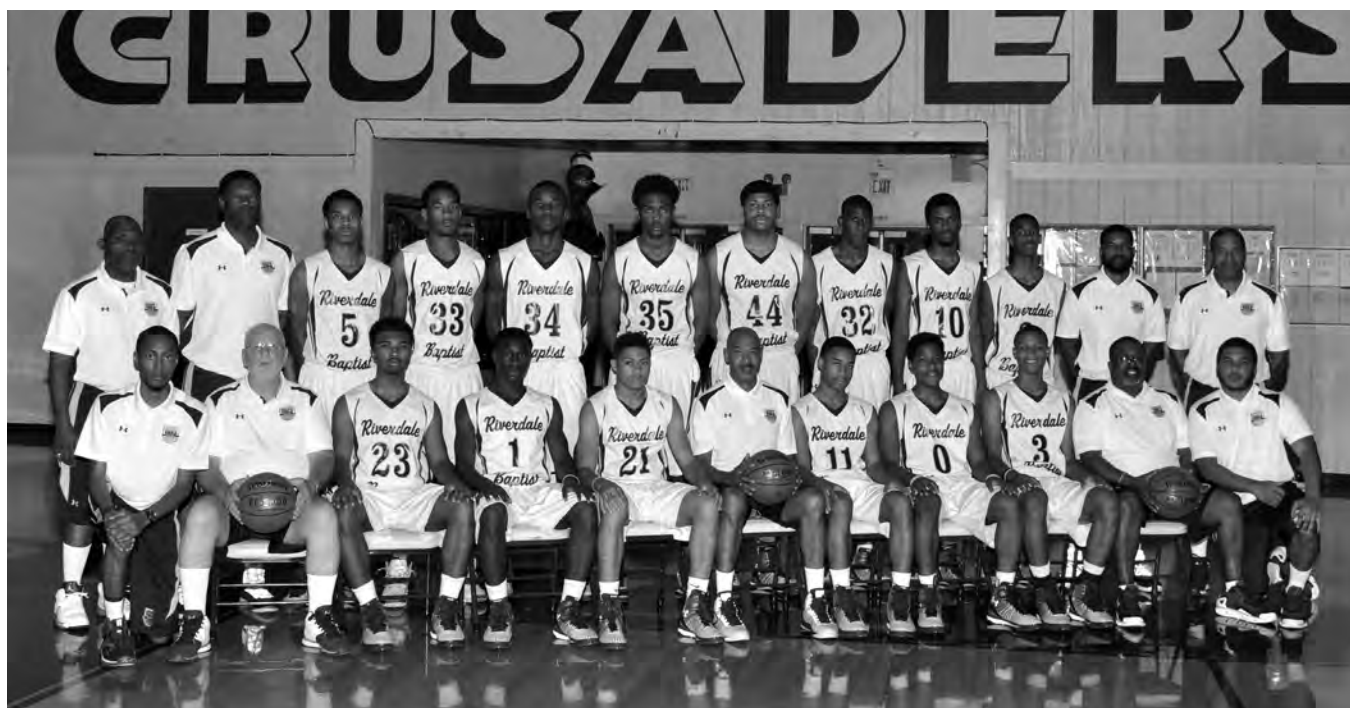

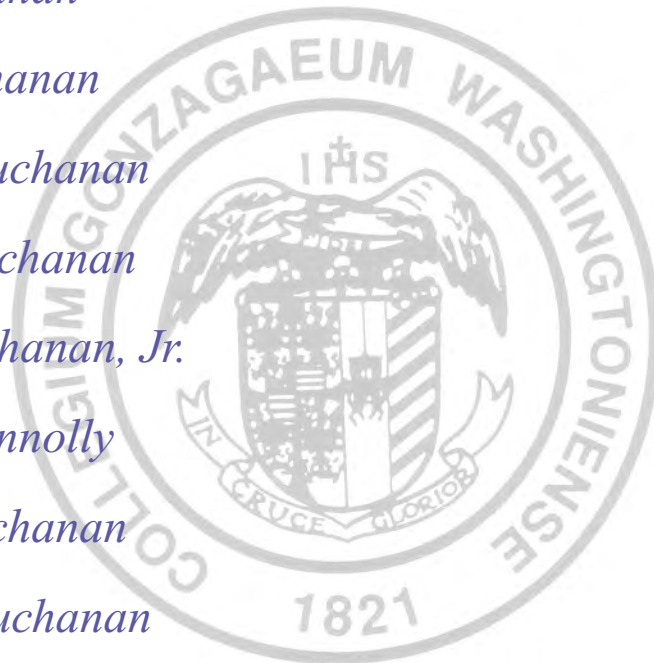

Gonzaga is the oldest educational institution in the old Federal City of Washington, opening its doors in 1821. The cornerstone of the original building on F Street, NW, was laid by Bishop Leonard Neale, auxiliary to Archbishop Carroll, the first American bishop of the Catholic Church, both Jesuits. The building was first opened only to Jesuit scholastics in 1820. After receiving numerous requests from Washington residents, the Washington Seminary, as Gonzaga was first known, began classes for lay students in 1821. Gonzaga flourished within sight of the Capitol and an easy carriage ride from the White House. On one famous occasion, President John Quincy Adams came to the Commencement at the school and examined the boys in Latin and Greek. The Jesuits had to depart the Seminary in 1827 due to conflicting rules about tuition but returned in 1848. The year was so successful that President Zachary Taylor presided at the Commencement. The school continued to operate under the charter of Georgetown College, but eventually succeeded in obtaining its own charter in 1858. On May 4, 1858, President James Buchanan signed into law the Act of Congress creating the "PRESIDENT AND DIRECTORS OF GONZAGA COLLEGE." Gonzaga was indeed a college and actually conferred a few bachelors degrees before phasing out the baccalaureate program by the turn of the century.

In 1859 the Jesuits built the great church of St. Aloysius on North Capitol Street which was quite rural at the time. In 1871, the school moved to be near the new Jesuit church and occupied Kohlmann Hall on Eye Street, NW. Kohlmann Hall had originally been built as an orphanage. This building housed the Jesuit community as well as the entire high school. In 1896 the school built Gonzaga College Hall, which houses one of the oldest theatres in the city. After more than 100 years, its stage still presents many theatrical performances. In 1912 Cardinal Gibbons presided over opening ceremonies of the new Main Building, now known as Dooley Hall. The facade, matching the theatre, provided a stately image in the busy neighborhood traffic of Eye Street.

Over the years Gonzaga's neighborhood changed and inner city tensions escalated. The parochial grade school closed. The building was acquired by Gonzaga and is now Cantwell Hall. Violence and destruction erupted with the city wide riots of 1968. Although fires burned all around the campus, the church and school were spared. However, a bleak period followed in which enrollment dropped and the school began to fail. In the early '70s serious thought was given to closing Gonzaga or moving it to the suburbs. Neither happened. Instead the Maryland Province of Jesuits declared its total commitment to Gonzaga as a school serving the inner city. Positive steps to save the school soon followed. The residents of the dilapidated housing across Eye Street were rehoused in newly built Sursum Corda, largely due to the efforts of Father Horace McKenna. The vacated area was developed into Buchanan Field, giving the school its first site for home football games in 100 years. With major help from alumni the school built the Carmody Center, housing a new gymnasium and reception area. The 1980s saw the addition of Forte Hall to the campus and the expansion of the field. When the Academy of Notre Dame closed its doors in the late '80s, Gonzaga incorporated its building, now known as Arrupe Hall, into the campus. Father Bernard Dooley, Gonzaga's president for 20 years, directed the school's revival, and before his retirement in 1994, oversaw the magnificent renovation of the Great Church of St. Aloysius. Since the mid-1980s, Gonzaga has enjoyed a steady increase in qualified applicants making admission more and more competitive and assuring a student body capable of continuing Gonzaga's excellent academic reputation.

Gonzaga celebrated its 175th anniversary in 1996. Under President Allen P. Novotny, S.J., Gonzaga has undergone substantial updating and renovation through a \$20 Million capital funding campaign. Phase I (*The Greater Glory*) of the campus master plan entailed the complete renovation of Cantwell and Arrupe Hall (renamed Ruesch Hall in recognition of the generous donation of the late Otto Ruesch and his family). These two buildings comprise a 21<sup>st</sup> century state-of-the-art academic facility with new science, music, and technology centers. Virtually all that remains of the original 19<sup>th</sup> century school buildings are the decorative facades on North Capitol and K Streets. The main entrance to Ruesch and Cantwell is now the magnificent Collins Rotunda named after the Collins family, long-time Gonzaga alumni and supporters. Phase II (*In Medias Res*) brought the renovation and expansion of the cafeteria, bookstore, and dining area, handicapped accessibility for the Theatre, Dooley Hall and St. Aloysius Church, and development of the old inner parking lot to a beautiful outdoor quadrangle. The old quadrangle and catwalk are no more the area has been transformed into a Commons area, serving as a student activity center and meeting/reception space for parents and friends. Phase II also brought changes to the Carmody Center new motorized bleachers and a new hardwood floor, an artificial surface for Buchanan Field, and a much-needed renovation of the Jesuit residence. Phase III (*Keeping the Promise*), initiated by Father Novotny in 2010, encompasses renovations to the historic Theatre, Dooley Hall, and Kohlmann Hall, as well as additions to the Carmody Center and a parking garage under Buchanan Field. The Gonzaga community was shocked and saddened by the sudden death of Rev. Allen Novotny, SJ in October 2010. Rev. Joseph Lingan SJ, a Gonzaga alum, Board member, and former chaplain served as the interim president, guiding the community through its difficulties. In July 2011 Rev. Stephen Planning SJ was appointed Gonzaga's 36th President, and he continues the fine work of his predecessors.

Applications and enrollments to the school have increased steadily since the early '80s and Gonzaga now has its largest student population ever. With the aid of generous alumni and benefactors, Gonzaga has been able to substantially increase its endowment assuring sound financial health for the foreseeable future. The increase in funding not only allows the school to moderate tuition increases, it also provides a greater opportunity for minority and disadvantaged students to attend Gonzaga through scholarship opportunities. Over a third of current Gonzaga students receive some form of financial assistance.

In a move that reinforces Gonzaga's commitment to the DC community, the Jesuit province started the Washington Jesuit Academy in September 2002, which is designed to prepare 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> graders from the inner city for high school. Gonzaga has a long history of triumphs and tragedies, but has come through them all stronger for the experience. Its mission remains one of educating "Men for Others", following the Jesuit vision as inspired by the life and teachings of Jesus Christ.

school was staffed by the Sisters of St. Francis from Glen Riddle, Pennsylvania. The initial faculty of five sisters, one of whom was the principal and superior, lived in a small convent on campus. The first eighth grade graduates, a class of six boys and five girls, were awarded their diplomas in 1927. In 1949 the pastor, Monsignor Kerr, had a dream which was to build a high school so that the strong Catholic educational program at Our Lady of Mount Carmel could meet the needs of the older children as well as the younger ones. In 1959, this long time dream was fulfilled with the building of the high school on the campus. Unfortunately, Monsignor Kerr died before the building was completed. The first high school graduating class of 1963, donated a plaque in honor of Monsignor Kerr and named the school's chapter of the National Honor Society after him. Today, Our Lady of Mount Carmel continues its college preparatory tradition while also enrolling students from Baltimore City, and Anne Arundel, Baltimore, and Harford counties. Roman Catholic High School, or simply "Roman," as it is often called, was founded in 1890 by Thomas E. While students in the honors classes learn the same material at the same pace, it is believed that having students of the same level grouped together provides a better learning system.

Beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, Roman implemented a 1:1 iPad initiative, starting with the incoming freshmen to accommodate the ever-changing face of education by providing students with different tools and strategies. The initiative allows students and teachers to individualize and differentiate instruction in ways that are familiar to today's students. Students will work on essential 21st century skill sets needed to meet state and national standards.

Roman Catholic has been prominent in the Philadelphia Catholic League in basketball since the League's inception, winning 28 championship games since 1920. Roman has also produced successful football, crew, golf, and ice hockey teams.

**CALVERT HALL**

**MD**

Founded in 1845, Calvert Hall College, a Catholic and Lasallian college preparatory school, provides a diverse community of young men with a broad and balanced human and Christian education through excellent academic and extracurricular programs that promote leadership, achievement, and service within the church and community. Steeped in the educational legacy of St. John Baptist de La Salle, Calvert Hall focuses on academic excellence, diversity, community, respect, and brotherhood. Through caring relationships, students develop their potential and pursue self-discipline and community action that bring spiritual, personal and academic goals to fruition.

In the early 1840s, Archbishop Samuel Eccleston sought to open a school for the boys of the Cathedral parish in Baltimore. Eventually, Brother Francis McMullen, FSC (“Fratres Scholarum Christianarum,” or Christian Brothers), a native of Baltimore, was assigned as director of the new school on Saratoga Street. On September 15, 1845, the Brothers assembled 100 students for the celebration of Mass and the opening of what was to become the first permanent foundation of the De La Salle Christian Brothers in the United States. The steady increase in enrollment eventually necessitated the purchase of a new property at Cathedral and Mulberry Streets. In 1891 Cardinal James Gibbons presided at the dedication and blessing of the new building. In September 1960, under the leadership of Brother Gabriel Cannon, FSC, Calvert Hall moved to its current location in Towson. The 32-acre site would allow for the continued growth of its academic and extracurricular programs and accommodate the increasing demand for Catholic, college preparatory education in the metropolitan area. The initial construction consisted of a classroom building, later named Keelty Hall, and the Brothers’ Residence.



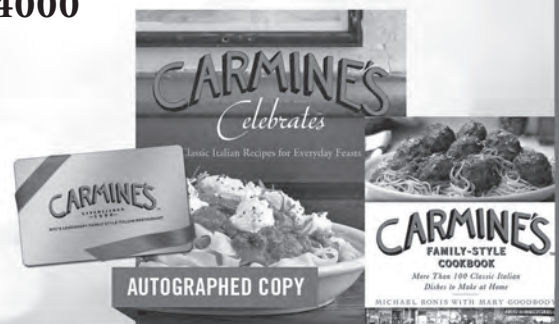

## Tournament History

**2013** The 25th DC Classic provided a roller-coaster ride for all the teams and their fans. There were upsets and overtime games that kept the fans and players alike on the edge of their seats. On Day One, Cesar Chavez (DC) trailed most of the game but came back to upset John Carroll (MD) 47-40. Game two found host Gonzaga, without two key players due to injuries, falling to Lafayette (KY) 77-71. In the two later games, order was restored as Molloy (NY) defeated Coolidge (DC) 69-48 and Mt. St. Joseph (MD) held off a game Herndon (VA) team 78-71. Day One was highlighted at halftime of the Gonzaga game with a special presentation to retiring Chairman John McLaughlin honoring his many years of service as chairman of the Gonzaga DC Classic Committee.

On Day Two, the first two games were similar. Gonzaga was not able to get out of an early hole again and lost to John Carroll 65-57, and Herndon could not make up a large first quarter deficit and fell to Coolidge 65-51. The two semi-final games provided lots of tense moments. Cesar Chavez pulled out a double overtime thriller to defeat Lafayette 96-91. Chavez was led by Tony Blackwell's 27 points, including 6 three pointers, offsetting an impressive performance by the Generals' Jackson Davis's 34 points. In a very well-played, balanced, and close game, defending champion Mt. St. Joseph defeated Molloy 63-60. Mt. St. Joseph, led almost the entire game behind senior guard Phil Booth while Malloy was led by senior guard Gabriel Kilpatrick's 22 points.

The final day began with an overtime victory by Herndon over John Carroll. Herndon was led by All-Tournament selection Dorian Johnson's 30 points. All-Tournament selection Doug Farley, 19 points, led the Coolidge defeat of Gonzaga. Then Malloy easily defeated Lafayette in the third place game. Both Lafayette's Jackson Davis (24 points and 15 rebounds) and Molloy's Jayson Cethoute (24 points) were selected to the All-Tournament team. In the final, Mt. St. Joseph claimed another DC Classic title by wearing down the Cesar Chavez squad 71-58. Chavez's All-Tournament selections, Tony Blackwell and Tristan Thompson, could not contain their counterparts from Mt. St. Joseph, MVP selection Jordan McNeil (22 points) and fellow All-Tournament selections Daveyon Barnes (18 points, 16 rebounds) and Phil Booth (14 points)..

**2012** The 24th Annual DC Classic had a familiar feel to it with each school previously in the Classic. The first round was favorable to the local teams. Sidwell Friends defeated Germantown Academy 63-57. Number one ranked Gonzaga defeated Archbishop Molloy, coached by New York coaching legend Jack Curran, 78-66. Bullis defeated Roman Catholic, coached by Chris McNesby who participated in the Classic as a player, assistant coach and now head coach, 61-49. Mount St. Joseph ended the local team run by beating Archbishop Carroll 59-54. In the first semi-final, Josh Hart (37 points) led a red hot Sidwell team in an upset over Gonzaga ending the host team's 19 game winning streak. In the nightcap, St Joseph

broke open a close game over Bullis setting up another DC/Baltimore final. Day Three of the Classic moved for the first time to the GW Smith Center. In the seventh place game, it took overtime for Germantown Academy to hold off Carroll 51-49. In the fifth place game Molloy held on to beat Roman Catholic 54-52. Gonzaga rebounded with a resounding defeat of Bullis 79-42 to take third place. In a back and forth close game, St Joseph outlasted Sidwell despite a game high 37 points by Josh Hart. For only the second time in Classic history, a member of the runner-up team was named MVP. Hart broke the Tournament scoring record of almost twenty years held by Maryland great Juan Dixon with 98 points. Joining Hart on the All-Tournament team were McGloin (Sidwell), Antwan Haskins (Carroll), Anthony Thompson (Bullis), Chaz Watler (Molloy), Shep Garner (Roman Catholic), Kris Jenkins and Charles Glover (Gonzaga), Kameron Williams and Phil Booth (Mount St. Joseph).

led by Senior Cahli Thomas and sophomores Nate Britt and Kris Jenkins, defeated a solid Charlotte Christian (NC) Squad, led by Navy Recruit Worth Smith and Anthony Gill (South Carolina). The Eagles won the game at the foul line, making nearly 90% of their free throws (15-17) while the Knights, from Charlotte, N.C. could manage only 52% (11-21). The consolation game featured New York area rivals Holy Cross against St. Raymond of the Bronx, a three-time participant, with the Ravens of St. Raymond edging the Knights 69-64. Local teams Good Counsel and Chantilly, both making their second appearance in the tournament rounded out the tournament field with four timer Mt. St. Joseph and St. John Shrewsbury (MA), a second-time participant. Once again the tournament’s reputation as a showcase for underclass talent held true as the tournament hosted a number of college coaches and scouts assessing the wide range of talent among the tournament’s young scholar-athletes.

**2009** The 2009 DC Classic saw a continuation of home team dominance by the host Eagles who defeated a talented Mater Dei (CA) team in a thrilling final at American University. Dallas Jesuit (TX) returned to the tournament for the third time but could not keep up with the Eagles in a first day match up. The Mater Dei Monarchs, led by USC bound Gary Franklin and UCLA bound Tyler Lamb squeaked by a tough Chantilly (VA) team making its first appearance in the tournament, then fought off a determined McNamara (MD) squad to reach the final against the Eagles. Gonzaga eased past Calvert Hall (MD) in the semi-finals to set up the hoped for matchup between the Monarchs and the Eagles. The crowd expected a tough, hard fought game and it was not disappointed. Mater Dei took over in the third quarter leading by more than ten points. The Eagles, led by senior guards Cedric Lindsay and Tyler Thornton chipped away at the lead and managed to pull out the win with a great team effort featuring timely support from freshmen, Nate Britt and Kris Jenkins. Sidwell Friends (DC) and Iona Prep (NY) also made their first trips to the tournament marking the first time in 15 years 4 new teams were introduced to the special hospitality of the DC Classic tournament committee. The tournament’s reputation as a showcase for local and national talent continued to grow as a number of area and national coaches were on hand to see the talented seniors and underclassmen in the 21st DC Classic.

**2008** The 20<sup>th</sup> DC Classic was not only a milestone for the tournament and its volunteer committee members, it was also the first ever three-peat for tournament host Gonzaga. This time, coming off one of the best seasons in school history and returning three key players, including Duke and Princeton bound players, Tyler Thornton and Ian Hummer, respectively, the Eagles came

into the tournament as the clear favorite and they did not disappoint. Gonzaga rolled into the finals with a blow out victory against an overmatched Bullis squad then carried that momentum to a strong 20 point final victory over arch rival St. John's (DC), appearing in the tournament for the third time. The Eagles were led by book-end junior guards Cedrick Lindsay, the tournament MVP, and Thornton, and senior center, Ian Hummer. The tournament welcomed St. John's (MA) the first time in the tournament's history from Massachusetts. Coolidge (DC) appeared in the tournament for the 7<sup>th</sup> time including an appearance in the maiden tournament in 1989. Consistent with the celebration by the DC Classic of a long and successful tournament history, the tournament committee had the honor of welcoming back legendary Coach Jack Curran and his Stanners from Archbishop Molloy (NY) for the 6<sup>th</sup> time. The Stanners featured an outstanding individual performance by Senior Russ Smith. The tournament also featured the first appearance by Benedictine from Richmond, Virginia.

**2007** The Gonzaga Eagles entered the 19<sup>th</sup> DC Classic as a clear favorite off the Eagles stellar 2006 season and the return of all key starters, including 2006 DC Classic MVP, Cameron Johnson. The Eagles reached the finals with victories over tournament newcomer All Hallows (NY) and Fremont (CA), appearing in its second straight tournament. On the other side of the bracket, Bishop Loughlin of New York, a tournament veteran, made it look easy with a blow out win against overmatched Towson Catholic and a convincing win over Philadelphia power, and tourney veteran, Roman Catholic. In the final, Gonzaga burst out to a quick lead taking advantage of the Lions' pressing defense to score some easy baskets. The Eagles looked like a national power behind a stifling defense led by senior Max Kenyi and the overall play of MVP Ian Hummer. The Lions were led by James Johnson and Doron Lamb. The tournament field also included St. John's Catholic Prep (MD) and WCAC rival, Bishop McNamara. Coach Steve Turner's Eagles had what may have been their best season in history in 2007-08, finishing 34-1 and winning both the WCAC regular season and tournament titles, along with the DC City Championship.

**2006** History repeated itself in 2006 to the delight of fans of the host Gonzaga Eagles. In 1993 Coach Dick Myers won his first DC Classic title after having been upset in the first round the previous year. The 2005 Eagles also lost on the first day. However, as in 1993, the Eagles bounced back with a superb performance in 2006 thoroughly outclassing pre-tournament favorite St. Frances of Baltimore, making its 3<sup>rd</sup> Tournament appearance. The Eagles led throughout, surging to a 50-27 halftime lead before prevailing comfortably 82-56. Sean Mosely led the Panthers of St. Frances while the Eagles were led by tournament MVP, Cameron Johnson. The tournament featured two new West Coast teams, Fremont from Oakland and Horizon from San Diego, and an old East Coast favorite, Archbishop Molloy.

**2005** The 17<sup>th</sup> annual tournament turned into an all Baltimore final when nationally ranked Mount St. Joseph and St. Frances reached the final marking the first time two Baltimore teams played in the Championship Game. While the two teams were closely matched, the senior depth of Mount St. Joseph, led by tournament MVP Dejuan Goodwin and George Mason bound Louis Birdsong proved too much for the Panthers of St. Frances who were led by sophomore Sean Mosely and Senior Deshawn Bradshaw. Roman Catholic (PA) nearly spoiled the all Maryland final but succumbed in one semifinal to the eventual champion 56-54 despite the efforts of all tournament team members Bradley Wanamaker and Mike Ringgold of the Cahillites from Philadelphia. Newcomer St. Stephens/St. Agnes made it into the semifinal by upsetting host Gonzaga in first night action at Gonzaga but could not overcome the talented Panthers of St. Frances at the larger Bender Arena (AU) venue for second day action. The Cadets of St. Johns (DC) and DCIAA member Eleanor Roosevelt High (DC) along with tournament veteran, Bishop Loughlin (NY), rounded out the field. The tournament raised over \$55,000 for Gonzaga's local, regional, national and international Charitable Service Projects.

**2004** The 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Tournament featured a renewal of the historic rivalry between DeMatha and Gonzaga who met in the tournament final for the third time. It was an old rivalry with a significant twist, however. The Stags were appearing for the first time without the retired legend, Morgan Wooton while the Eagles were in their first season under new coach Steve Turner, after the retirement of long time coach and teacher, Dick Myers. The tournament field also included Westbury Christian and Germantown Academy, both making their fourth appearance in the tournament, along with St. Albans, a five-time participant. Jesuit High from Carmichael, CA made its first visit to the tournament and also became the first team in the DC Classic from the West Coast. The Eagles appeared to be severe underdogs in the final after DeMatha's convincing wins over Westbury Christian and Mt. St. Joseph. However, the Eagles, behind the sharpshooting of seniors Paul Johnson and Brian Slaninka never trailed, until the last minute. Key plays by Nigel Munson and Mamadi Diane enabled the Stags to eke out a last minute victory, 54-51, marking the Stags 3<sup>rd</sup> DC Classic Championship, but the first behind Coach Mike Jones.

**2003** 2003 marked the historic 15<sup>th</sup> year of the tournament and featured McQuaid Jesuit and Archbishop Molloy (NY) and

Georgetown Prep. The host Eagles raced into the Championship game with convincing wins over Potomac School (VA) and St. Joseph Prep (PA) behind the solid play of seniors Stanley Hodge and Antwan Harrison and junior forward Paul Johnson. In the other bracket Georgetown Prep used Seniors Roy Hibbert (7'2"), Davis Nwankwo (6'9") and Aris Williams (6'9") to get past McQuaid and two-time tournament champion Archbishop Molloy, coached by the legendary Jack Curran and led by senior standout Sundiata Gaines. In a dream final featuring two neighboring Jesuit rivals the height of the little Hoyas and a semi-final injury to Gonzaga star Antwan Harrison allowed Georgetown Prep to control the final despite a late charge by the Eagles. Prep pulled away at the end to win 46-38 behind tournament MVP Roy Hibbert, Jr. The tournament's final day also featured a shooting exhibition between Mount St. Joseph and McQuaid. McQuaid's Jack Leasure set a new record for Three Point Field Goals with 9 for the game (8 in the fourth quarter) and 18 for the tournament, but the Gaels of Mount St. Joseph prevailed in part because of the free throw perfection of Brian Johnson who made all 13 tries during the tournament including 10-10 against the Black Knights of McQuaid. The out of town teams were treated to a special tour of the Capitol. The tournament also marked the last DC Classic for Gonzaga's own legendary coach Dick Myers who retired after the season.

**2002** The 14<sup>th</sup> DC Classic featured the return of national power and previous tournament Champion Christ the King from NY. Local upstart, The Potomac School, led by junior Peter Prowitt, nearly pulled off the upset of the tournament missing a last second shot to fall by one point to the Royals in the 1<sup>st</sup> round. The Tournament also featured West Forsyth, the first participant from North Carolina, led by Wake Forest bound Chris Paul, Mervo School, and Paul VI all making their first tournament visit. The 2<sup>nd</sup> round featured a long awaited match up of local Jesuit rivals, Georgetown Prep and Gonzaga. The Eagles, led by senior Luke Owings defeated the Little Hoyas who were led by 7' 2" junior center Roy Hibbert, Jr. The Eagles brought their pressing defense and fast paced game into the final against the co-favorite Royals who had little trouble in the semi-finals beating a tough Paul VI team. The final was an epic battle from the start with Christ the King holding a small lead at the end of each quarter, only to see the Eagles tie in the last minutes. In the end, the Royals, led by tournament MVP Japhet McNeil and Brian Williams prevailed in a controversial last minute exchange, 50 - 48. The Eagles were led by Senior Luke Owings and Juniors Antwan Harrison and Stanley Hodge.

**2001** The 13<sup>th</sup> edition of the DC Classic was held with subdued excitement due to the tragedies of 9/11. Jack Curran brought his Stanners from Archbishop Molloy (NY) to the tournament for the third time, seeking championship number two. The main competition figured to come from highly ranked Germantown Academy (PA) led by super seniors Matt Walsh (FL) and Lee Melchionni (Duke). Fighting through injuries and illness Germantown was unable to overcome the Stanners in one semi-final

match up. In the other semi-final host Gonzaga, featuring a talented group of underclassmen faced Houston power Westbury Christian, led by 2002 national player of the year runner up, Ndudi Ebi. The Wildcats advanced to the final with a thrilling and controversial last minute victory over the host Eagles, led by senior Chris Sumner. In the final, the Stanners took advantage of the Wildcats' let down and steadily pulled away from the Wildcats. The Stanners were led by junior point guard Marlon Smith and senior forwards Kevin Diffly and Kevin Hamilton. The 2001 tournament also featured newcomers Roanoke Catholic (VA) and T. C. Williams (VA) of "Remember the Titans" fame. With highly touted underclassmen such as Ebi, J. R. Reynolds of Roanoke Catholic and Stanley Hodge of Gonzaga, the tournament attracted a large number of college coaches and scouts.

**2000** The 12<sup>th</sup> annual tournament provided another thrilling ending. Old friends South Lafourche and Coolidge High, were joined by Strake Jesuit (Houston), St. Joseph's Prep (PA), St. John's Prospect Hall (MD) and long time Gonzaga neighbors and rivals Good Counsel and Georgetown Prep. Gonzaga renewed its rivalry against Prep with a hard fought semifinal victory. Good Counsel advanced in the other bracket taking advantage of inconsistent play from Scott Bouzigard's Tarpons of South Lafourche and the absence of key players from Strake Jesuit. In the final, Gonzaga, often led by two freshmen Antwan Harrison and Eric Price, roared from behind then prevailed in a thrilling overtime victory. After an 0-4 start in tournament championships, the Eagles had now won 5 of the last 8 tournaments. The tournament showcased some rising stars and rising teams including St. John's and St. Joseph's, and particularly Georgetown Prep behind new coach and former Georgetown star Dwayne Bryant, a college teammate of Gonzaga star Mark Tillman. Honoring his 12 years of service to the tournament and leadership as tournament chairman, the MVP trophy was permanently named the "John J. McLaughlin MVP Award."

**1999** The 11<sup>th</sup> annual tournament produced a familiar "refrain" as tournament favorite Roman Catholic went down to defeat to Archbishop Molloy (NY) coached by legendary 'two sport coach' Jack Curran. Molloy and Roman were joined by local teams Archbishop Spalding (MD) and McNamara (MD). Host Gonzaga sported a young team that could not match up with eventual winner Molloy in the semi-final despite a strong effort by Senior Center Howard Blue. Bishop Loughlin (NY) succumbed in the semi-final unable to control national player of the year Eddie Griffin for Roman Catholic. Sunday's tournament final showed that

after 40 years of coaching baseball and basketball and receiving coach of the year awards in both sports, Molloy's Jack Curran still had the touch. The Stanners produced a smothering defense that hampered Roman's Eddie Griffin. Junior big men Wendell Gibson and James Hauser lead a balanced attack that constantly produced open shots. In the end the Stanners frustrated the Cahillites and Coach Curran had his first DC Classic championship in his second try.

**1998** The tournament celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary with equal amounts of fanfare and anticipation. The tournament field included returning powers South Lafourche and DeMatha. South Lafourche turned on a tenacious pressing defense right from the opening tip-off, surprising the Cahillites of favored Roman Catholic of Philadelphia, leading to the long awaited rematch with DeMatha. The Stags, led by seniors Keith Bogans and Joe Forte, proved too much for the Tarpons in one of the semi-final match ups. On the other side of the tournament bracket, Gonzaga moved ahead, winning its first two games against Longwood (NY) and Towson Catholic (MD), setting up a dream match against DeMatha, the nation's #1 ranked high school. Although recognized as a skilled team, Gonzaga was given little chance against DeMatha, a team touted by *USA Today* as the most talented high school basketball team in the past twenty years. In one of the most exciting high school games in memory, Gonzaga outlasted DeMatha in a thrilling, overtime victory won by a last second foul shot from Gonzaga senior floor leader Billy Glading. He was ably supported by seniors Pat Mitchell, Brandon Newby and Tim Folan. The Stags were again led by senior All-Americans, Joe Forte, unprecedented repeat MVP, and Keith Bogans. An international element was introduced to the service projects supported by the tournament through the addition of a senior summer work project in the Dominican Republic.

**1997** The 9<sup>th</sup> tournament registered another first with the Gonzaga Eagles' Wings-sponsored, congressional reception hosted by Congressman Billy Tauzin (LA). Newcomers, South Lafourche (LA) and Westbury Christian (TX), attended the reception and provided a refreshing Southwest flavor to the tournament. South Lafourche outplayed Gonzaga in the tournament semi-final, gaining the chance to meet national power DeMatha, coached by the legendary Morgan Wooten. Despite a decided height and depth disadvantage, the Tarpons of South Lafourche, behind the play of juniors Clarence Moore and Ross Chouest, stayed with DeMatha until the very end, before falling to the Stags and their junior stars, MVP Joe Forte and Keith Bogans.

**1996** In its 8<sup>th</sup> year the tournament continued to expand, recruiting the Red Cloud Indian School of Pine Ridge, SD. Red

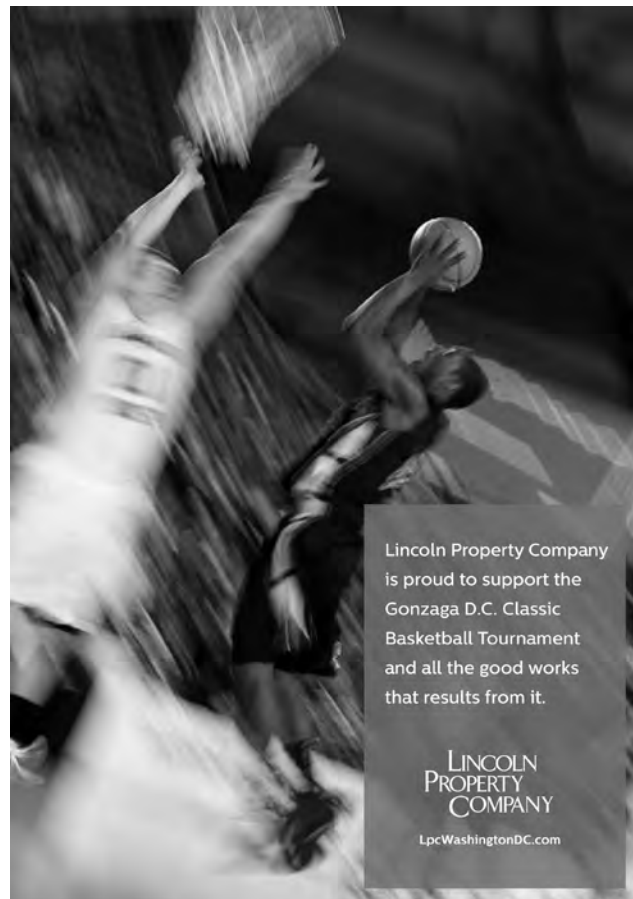

## Tournament History (continued)

Cloud's visit included several intercultural exchanges and resulted in a visit to Red Cloud by Gonzaga students the following summer, the start of an annual student service project. Gonzaga became the first three-time champion with a convincing win against highly regarded Bishop Loughlin, which had earned a place in the final with a defeat of nationally ranked, NY rival, Bishop Rice. Unfortunately, the success of the tournament was marred by the sudden death of Mike Kelleher, tournament founder and inspiration. In his honor, the tournament renamed its Scholar-Athlete award the Mike Kelleher Scholar Athlete award.

**1995** The 7<sup>th</sup> year of the tournament was dominated by juniors Mark Karcher, the tournament MVP, playing for nationally ranked St. Frances, and Alvin Brown of Gonzaga, who met in the tournament final. Gonzaga became the first team to win the tournament twice, repeating its 1993 1st place finish with a dominating defensive performance. Players from Herndon H.S. (Herndon, VA.) and St. Raymond joined host Gonzaga at Children's Hospital where tournament Chairman, John McLaughlin, presented Children's with a check from the tournament. Halftime of the final featured the announcement of the 1st annual Scholar Athlete Award, presented to Gonzaga's team trainer, senior John Gans (Northwestern).

**1994** The 6<sup>th</sup> DC Classic featured three of the nation's top teams: DeMatha, ranked #1; Roman Catholic ranked #4; and LaSalle Academy (NYC), ranked as high as #6 during the year. The tournament's geographic horizons were stretched by the addition of Jesuit College Prep (Dallas, TX). In the semi-finals, Roman Catholic stunned DeMatha at the buzzer. In the final, LaSalle rode tournament MVP Shammgod Wells' (Providence) 20 points and superb ball handling to a decisive 57-48 win over the Cahillites. Visiting teams were treated to a private tour of the White House, a tournament tradition. George Washington's head coach, Mike Jarvis (now at St. John's) was the keynote speaker at the renewed team breakfast for all participants.

**1993** Host Gonzaga started momentum toward an outstanding season with a victory in the championship game of the milestone, 5<sup>th</sup> Gonzaga DC Classic. The tournament invitees included nationally ranked St. Raymond (NYC) and Archbishop Wood (Phila.). St. Raymond, behind Kareem Reid (Univ. of Arkansas) and Charlton Clarke (UMass.), cruised to the final with easy wins over Langley (VA) and Wood. In the final, Gonzaga star and tournament MVP Kenny McFarland (St. Bonaventure) sank a buzzer-beating lay up to climax a breathtaking 63-61 come-from-behind win over the Ravens. The tournament also featured an alumni match-up between local and long-time rivals, Gonzaga and St. John's, that preceded the tournament final.

**1992** An strong field drew media attention to the tournament in 92. Teams included defending national champion Dunbar of Baltimore and Philadelphia city champion, Roman Catholic. Dunbar nipped Anacostia in the game opener termed, "worthy of any tournament championship," by the *Washington Post*. Washington's St. Albans, featuring Anwar McQueen, lost its only game of the year to Roman Catholic in first-round action. In the final, Roman Catholic, behind the strong play of tournament MVP Marc Jackson (Temple), shocked Dunbar, led by Keith Booth (Maryland), to end the Poets' 57-game winning streak.

**1991** In its 3<sup>rd</sup> year, the tournament expanded to an eight-team format and received national recognition by Street and Smith. The field was headlined by perennial New York powers Christ the King and Archbishop Molloy, coached by Jack Curran, and by Southern of Baltimore. Undaunted but undersized Gonzaga, led by two-sports stars, Ike Wilkins (Northeastern) and Chad Leonard (The Citadel), stunned Molloy in the semi-finals and was leading heavily favored Christ the King deep into the third quarter before falling to the Royals, led by Jason Cipola (Syracuse) and Rich Veteri (George Mason).

**1990** The tournament field expanded to six teams in its 2<sup>nd</sup> year including perennial high school basketball power St. Anthony's of Jersey City. In the tournament final, Dunbar of Baltimore, led by Terrence Alexander and Donta Bright (UMass), nipped St. Anthony's powered by high school All-Americans Danny Hurley (Seton Hall) and Roderick Rhodes (Kentucky/Southern California/Houston Rockets) in overtime. The loss proved to be St. Anthony's only loss of the year. Washington's own Dunbar H. S. finished only third in the tournament, even though it was nationally ranked all year.

**1989** The Gonzaga DC Classic, organized by a committee of volunteers from the Gonzaga Fathers' Club, inaugurated the annual December tournament. Playing at the tournament's regular home, Bender Arena at the American University, the four-team field gave fans a taste of the excitement to come. Washington's Coolidge H. S. and Dunbar (Baltimore) joined local rivals, DeMatha and host Gonzaga. In the tournament final, televised by Home Team Sports Network, DeMatha, behind Kenny Blakeney (Duke), beat a strong Gonzaga team led by Robert Churchwell (Georgetown).

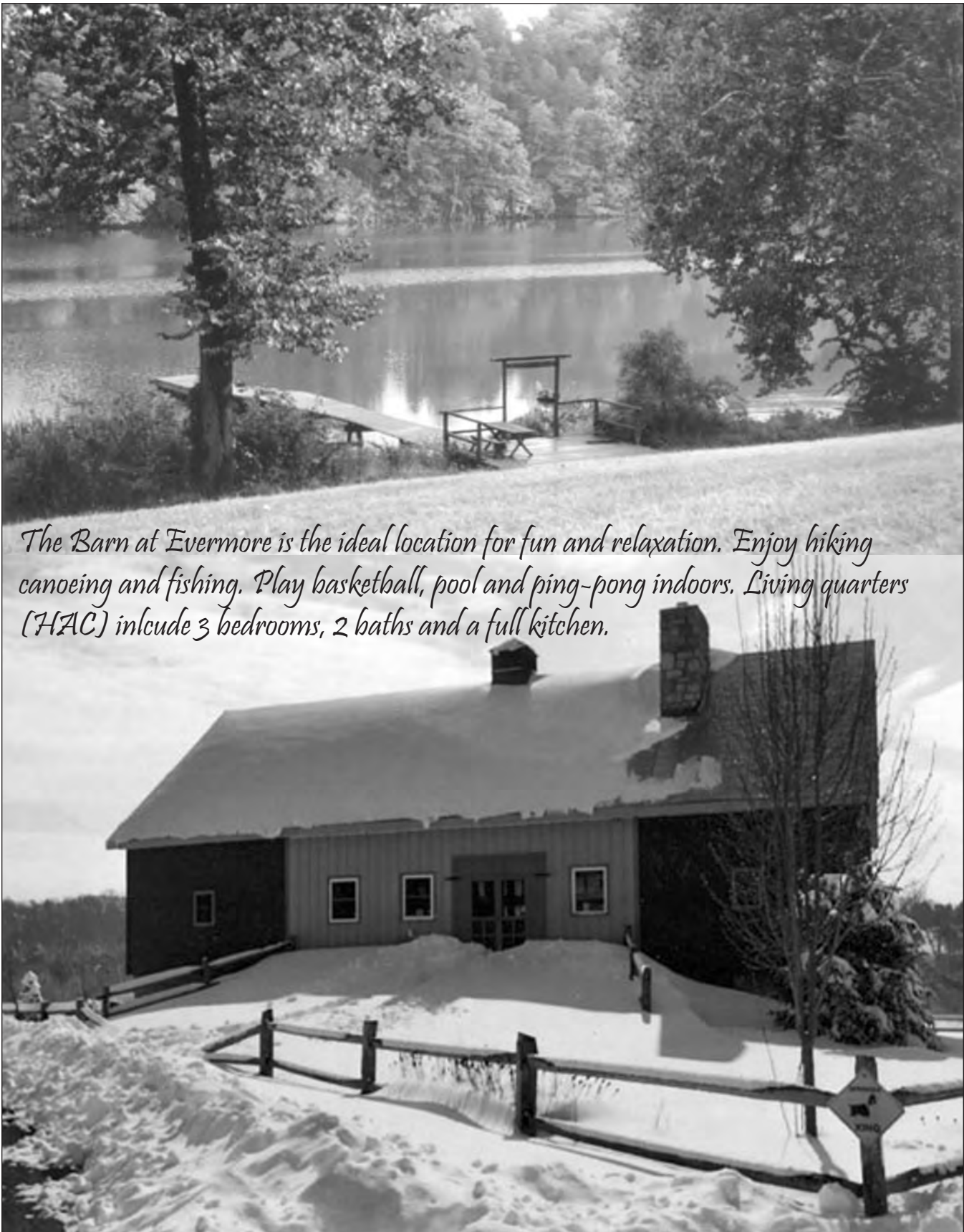

## DC Classic - Top Five Games

5. **1998 - Longwood v. Bullis.** The longest game in tournament history took four overtimes before the Longwood Lions prevailed. It was the first DC Classic for both teams.
4. **1993 - Gonzaga v. St. Raymond.** Gonzaga had lost in the first round in the 1992 tournament and had lost in its only other tournament final appearance (1991). In the 1993 final, the Eagles faced a stacked St. Raymond team that featured three Division I recruits, led by point guard Kareem Reid (Arkansas). The game stayed close for the first three periods, but St. Raymond's threatened to pull away in the fourth period. The Eagles held St. Raymond's to only 3 points in the final 9:24 to give the Eagles a chance to win. After forcing a turnover with only 5 seconds left, with the score tied at 61, the Eagles inbounded the ball from the far end of the court to junior center Ahmed Evans, at half court. Ahmed immediately turned and passed to Senior Kenny McFarland (St. Bonaventure) who was racing toward the Eagles' basket. Kenny put up an awkward running shot with enough touch to bank in right as the buzzer sounded signaling Gonzaga's first tournament victory.
3. **1994 - Roman Catholic v. DeMatha.** Only a year after Gonzaga's thrilling last second championship game victory, two national powers faced off in the semi-finals of the sixth annual tournament. DeMatha was ranked No. 1 in the country coming off a 28-4 season with almost its entire 1993-4 squad intact including guards Tim Hill (Harvard) and Terry McGann (Furman). In the tournament semi-finals they faced Roman Catholic of Philadelphia, led by Lari Ketner (U. Mass.) and Donnie Carr (LaSalle). The Cahillites were also ranked among the top ten teams in the country. Both teams entered the tournament undefeated. In the thrilling semi-final, Roman started fast and held a small lead throughout the game. When DeMatha's Greg Cristell (Florida) fouled out with over 4 minutes left, Roman's Lari Ketner figured to control inside. However, after falling behind by 5 points, the Stags went on a 6-0 run to take a one point lead with only 7 seconds left. Roman senior guard Will McKnight took the inbound pass and drove furiously up the court releasing a soft floater as time expired for the upset. The next day, as Roman visited the White House (a tournament tradition) young Mr. McKnight was quite the celebrity to the White House Secret Service detail. Ironically, Roman did not win the tournament. It faced Shammgod Wells (Providence/**Wizards**), Ron Artest (St. Johns/**Rockets**), and LaSalle Academy (NY), another undefeated team, in the finals. The end of that game typified the dominance of MVP Wells who dribbled away the last minutes with the entire (it seemed) Roman Catholic team in pursuit.
2. **1990 - Dunbar v. St. Anthony's.** The second tournament also attracted several nationally ranked teams including St. Anthony's (NJ) and Dunbar (Balt.), along with D.C.'s Dunbar. Predictably, St. Anthony's and Dunbar (Balt.) met in the final, a repeat of another tournament final only a week before in which St. Anthony's squeaked out a victory over the Poets. In the DC Classic final the teams played a close, see saw battle for the entire game. Although very evenly matched and well coached the two teams played very different styles. The Poets, coached by Pete Pompey, were young and athletic playing an aggressive, pressing defense. St. Anthony's, under the helm of legendary Bob Hurley, played a more ball control game trying to slow the tempo for a half court offense featuring junior Rhoderick Rhodes. Fittingly, the game ended in a tie forcing overtime. In the end the Poets prevailed, led by Dante Bright (U. Mass.) and Terrence Alexander. St. Anthony's was led by Danny Hurley (Seton Hall) and Rhodes (USC). Ironically, it was the last loss of the year for St. Anthony's which finished No. 2 in the country. The very next week the two teams squared off again in a tournament in California where St. Anthony's beat Dunbar in another, close contest. It was the last loss for the Poets until the DC Classic Tournament Championship of 1992!

## DC Classic - Top Five Games (continued)

1. **1998 - Gonzaga v. DeMatha.** Despite the other great games described above, and still others that did not make this list, there can be no doubt what the greatest game in tournament history was - the 1998 epic final between the Eagles of host Gonzaga and the Stags of arch rival DeMatha. DeMatha entered the season, not only ranked No. 1 in the country but described as one of the best high school teams in the last twenty years. Not only were the Stags under the tutelage of the legendary Morgan Wooten, but the Stags featured two of the top five rated players in the country, Keith Bogans (Kentucky/**Magic**) and Joseph Forte (North Carolina/**Supersonics**). The Stags were also the defending DC Classic Champions and had most of their 1997 team back for another try. The Eagles were also a talented team, led by seniors Billy Glading and Pat Mitchell (James Madison) and a large cast of significant role players. Despite the obvious talent of the Stags, the Eagles came into the tournament a confident group. In a game described by broadcasters Glen Consor and Larry Michael as more like a college game than a high school game, the Eagles and Stags traded blows throughout a dramatic, error free game. At the end of the second half, the Stags wiped out a small Gonzaga lead forcing overtime. The game stayed close throughout overtime. With the Eagles clinging to a one point lead, Gonzaga's senior guard, Billy Glading, went to the foul line for two after he was fouled with three seconds remaining in overtime. He made the first putting the Eagles up by two. However, he missed the second shot. The rebound was grabbed by DeMatha's Joe Forte who turned and threw the ball the length of the court hoping for a 3 pointer. It missed and the Eagles won the championship. The Stags lost only three games with both of their senior stars playing, all three were to the Eagles who also finished nationally ranked.

## DC Classic - Top Team Performances

10. **1999 Archbishop Molloy** - the Stanners, from New York, methodically pulled away from a talented Roman Catholic (PA) team in the final and held National Player of the Year, Eddie Griffin, in check.
9. **1998 DeMatha Stags** - featuring bookend guards, Keith Bogans and Joseph Forte, the Stags, from Maryland, pulled away from a talented but out manned South Lafourche (LA) Tarpon team in the Final. The 1998 Stags, nearly a duplicate of the 1997 Team repeated their victory over South Lafourche in the 1998 semi-final but succumbed to the Eagles in the epic final.
8. **1993 Gonzaga Eagles** - the '93 Eagles were Gonzaga's first Champion, in dramatic, last second fashion, over nationally ranked St. Raymond (NY).
7. **1992 Roman Catholic** - the 1992 Cahillites, led by Senior Center Marc Jackson ended the Dunbar Poets' 57 game winning streak in dramatic fashion
6. **1996 Gonzaga Eagles** - the 1996-7 Eagles were led by Senior Alvin Brown, the tournament's MVP. The Eagles played three flawless games, dismantling a talented Bishop Loughlin (NY) team in the Final.
5. **1994 Lasalle Academy** - LaSalle (NY) stayed in the top five in the country most of the year. It prevailed against a Roman Catholic team that had just beaten previously No. 1 ranked DeMatha and was led by sophomore Ron Artest and Senior point guard Shammgod Wells.
4. **1990 St. Anthony's (NJ)** - the only loss of the year by St. Anthony's was to Dunbar (Balt.) in the tournament final.
3. **1990 Dunbar Poets** - although young, Dunbar (Balt.) suffered only two losses that year, both to St. Anthony's. The Poets only victory over St. Anthony's in 3 tries that year was in the DC Classic final, an epic, overtime battle.
2. **1998 Gonzaga Eagles** - the 1998 Eagles were a talented group of athletes who played together as a team and excelled at pressure games, winning both the tournament and the WCAC title against highly regarded DeMatha and going 5-1 during the season against nationally ranked DeMatha and Good Counsel, featuring Roger Mason, Jr.
1. **2007 Gonzaga Eagles** - the 2007 Eagles were probably the most talented Eagle team in tournament history completing back to back Championships featuring stifling defense and consistent offense from Cameron Johnson, Max Kenyi and tourney MVP, Ian Hummer.

## AND...

**1996 Red Cloud Indian School** - under-sized, out-manned and with only one week of practice before the tournament, the Native Americans of Red Cloud (SD) brought color, culture and excitement to the tournament. The Crusaders were competitive in every game against excellent competition. The tournament appearance provided the impetus for expansion of Gonzaga's service projects to Red Cloud's Pine Ridge Reservation, in the summer of 1997.

DC Classic - Top Individual Performances

6. **Josh Hart of Sidwell Friends** - Broke tournament scoring record held by Juan Dixon, by scoring 98 points in leading Sidwell Friends to a 2nd place finish. For his effort, he was named tournament MVP.
5. **Juan Dixon/Joe Forte** - Dixon dropped in 47 points in one game, a tournament record, for Calvert Hall in the 1996 tournament. Forte was the tournament MVP and almost single handedly put away South Lafourche in the tournament final in 1997.
4. **Jack Leasure** - All he did was single handedly drive McQuaid Jesuit to a near miracle upset of Mount St. Joseph (Balt.) in 2003 by scoring 27 fourth quarter points including 8 3 - pointers.
3. **Alvin Brown** - Gonzaga's Alvin Brown was an offensive and defensive force in the 1996 final where he shot 80% from the floor and led the Eagles to a dismantling of highly regarded Bishop Loughlin.
2. **Shammgod Wells** - Wells, literally, controlled the 1994 tournament with floor leadership and ball handling skills that completely frustrated Roman Catholic in the final.
1. **Pat Mitchell/Billy Glading** - Pat and Billy were the clear leaders of the thrilling 1998 tournament final victors. It was Pat who neutralized the taller Stag front court and proved the key to a victory secured, in the end, by the ability of Billy to outplay DeMatha's point guards and make several important baskets, including the game winner.

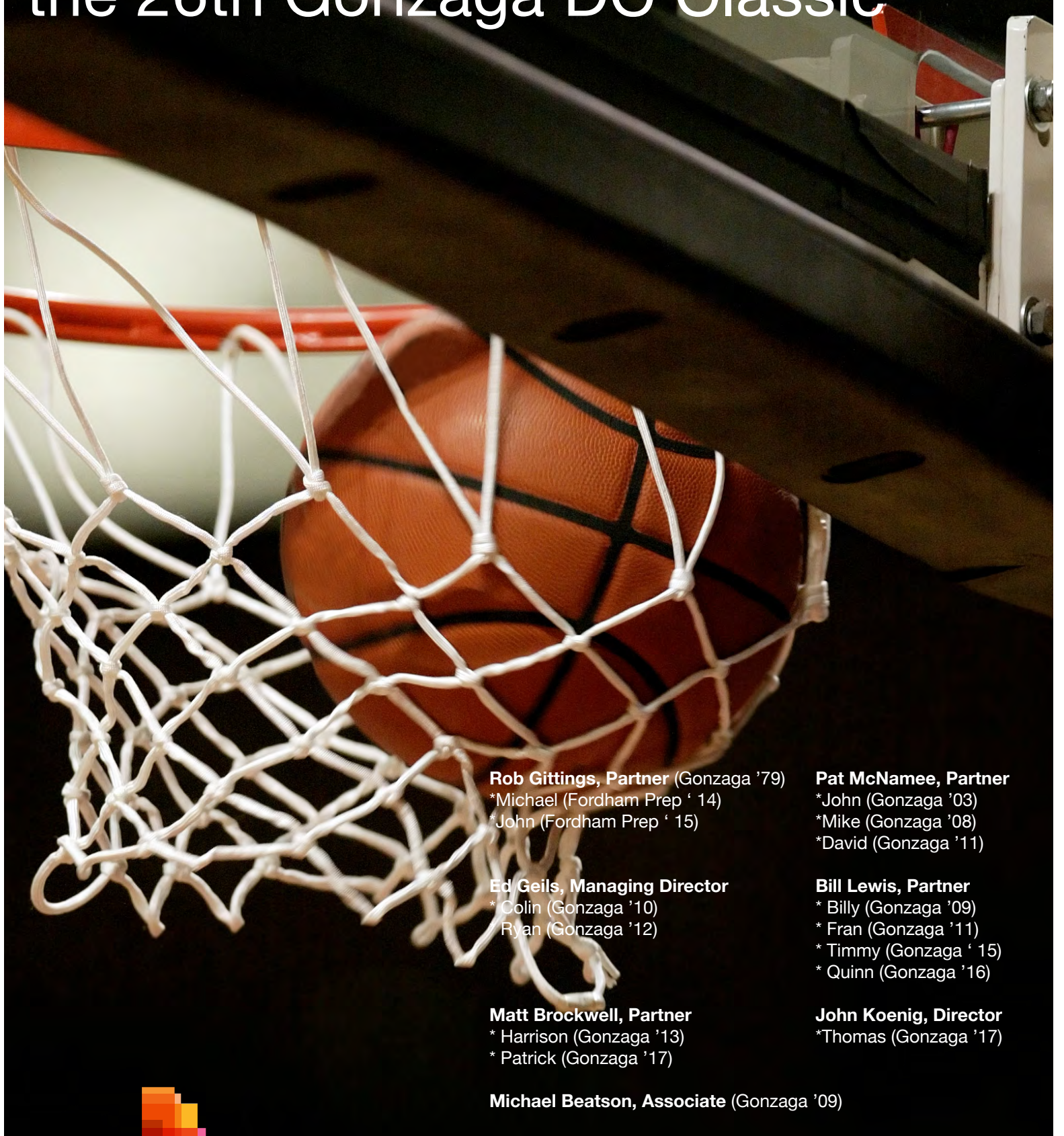
